

November 1st is All Saints' Day. We will be celebrating it this workand. Through the commencation

weekend. Through the commemoration of the solemnity of All Saints Day the Church reminds us that God's call for holiness is universal. We remember ordinary people who in their extraordinary ordinariness capture our attention and teach us to love God. We member people who become vessels of divine justice, mercy, and presence. Saints offer us inspiration, wisdom, intercession, and support.



From the earliest days of the Church we have remembered and prayed for the dead. The Month of November, especially Nov. 2, is dedicated to all the faithful departed. In this month we are asked to remember our dear departed members and pray to them. I encourage you to pray for your family, neighbors, parishioners and others who have died. Keep their memory alive by sharing with others how those who have died made an important impact in your life while they lived here on the earth. Make a visit to their tombs, offer Mass, take part in the Holy Mass for them and offer prayers for them. Remember that the Mass is the greatest prayer for the dead. A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who: On any and each day from November 1-8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the departed.

This has been a challenging time for all of us, but especially those who are isolated in their homes without the opportunity to receive the Most Blessed Sacrament and Anointing of the Sick. If you would like me to make a visit to you, a family member, or a neighbor and will be comfortable with my visit, I will be available for administering those sacraments.
