




FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Holy Week and the Easter season are quickly approaching. This weekend we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday. Laetare in Latin means rejoice. We are half-way through the season of Lent. Like Gaudete Sunday, Laetare Sunday provides a similar break about midway through a season which is otherwise of a penitential character. Before His passion and death while being with Nicodemus he tells "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." Healing came to the snake-bitten Israelites by looking at the bronze serpent hanging on a pole, so life is given to those who look up with the eyes of faith upon the Son of man hanging on the cross. It's also a time to reflect about how much God loved us on the wood of the cross. Rejoice because the Lord continues to call us, and to draw us close to himself.

This year the Church has the joy of celebrating a special year in

honor of Saint Joseph (December 8, 2020 - December 8, 2021). As the Spouse of the Mother of God and the Foster-Father of the Son of God, he had a unique responsibility to care for and protect the Holy Family. Consequently, he is also the Patron of the Universal Church. He protects and guides the Church, the Body of Christ, with the same paternal care he



showed to Our Lady and the Lord Jesus. I wish everyone happy Feast on the Solemnity of St. Joseph on March 19 also happy Feast of St Patrick on March 17. May St Joseph and St Patrick bless everyone.

On 15th of March 2021, I completed 6 years of my presence in this great country. A day to remember with gratitude all the blessings which I have received from God. I take this time to thank every one for your love and cooperation which I have received during my ministry. May the Lord bless you.

Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Church Furnaces

As this week marked the Anniversary of the COVID Pandemic, we at St. Joseph Parish have survived thanks to our united efforts. However, the two church furnaces that have served us well since 1988 are not fairing so well. We have repaired them numerous times over the past eight years, exceeding their lifespan. Unfortunately, one



unit needs repair yet again, and we have decided to replace the units instead of continuing to repair them. After considering four bids, the least expensive bid was chosen (which also happened to have the best warranty). The cost for each furnace is \$3,275.00 for a total of \$6,550.00. The work will proceed as soon as possible.

If any of you are able to contribute financially to this project, please consider doing so. We pray God's grace, and our ability to share our financial gifts, will cover the cost of this project, and especially with other needs looming as the weather improves. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.






