





FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Corpus Christi

Happy Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God! What a Gift we celebrate today! We commemorate God's greatest gift to mankind, the person of Jesus Christ. God gives us His Son, and then Christ gives us Himself. The gift of all gifts. This feast proclaims God's real presence in our midst in the Eucharist. Eucharist is not a symbol, not a representation, but the actual body and blood of Jesus Christ. Eucharist is a life-altering and life-transforming gift. It's redeeming.

The feast of Corpus Christi was first celebrated in Liege, Belgium in 1246. Pope Urban IV extended the feast to the entire Church in 1264. Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God's unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we are bonded together. Gift, gift-giver, and receiver meld into one in this sacrament of sacraments.

The gift of Jesus as bread was and continues to be a challenge to all followers of Jesus. Some surveys say that as many as 80% of Catholics do not believe that the Eucharist is really the Body and Blood of Christ. At the same time there are miracles of Eucharist happens even today. Only our faith will make us believers. One translation of the hymn Tantum Ergo of Saint Thomas Aquinas says: "Senses cannot grasp this marvel; faith alone must compensate."
