





Catechetical Sunday 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

September 19th, we celebrate Catechetical Sunday with the entire Church. This week we especially want to recognize our Faith Formation Catechists who began their mission of teaching. Also, catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all Catholics to rededicate themselves to the mission of handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel as a community of faith. We are all called to help pass on the faith and commit to be life-long learners. I invite you to pray for all the Religious Education staff. Please take the RE classes seriously as it is going to have an impact in the children's lives and in the life of the church. I would also remind the parents to send your students regularly to class. Let our children grow up knowing God and church.

In today's gospel, Jesus foretells his imminent suffering, death and resurrection. By using a child as an example for us today, Jesus teaches that we have to become like children in order to be great, whereby we are to live our lives in humble service to God and to one another.


