



## DID YOU KNOW?

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can do a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$100,000 a year from your IRA directly to a charity. The distribution won't show up in your adjusted gross income and CAN count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The QCD allows you to be more strategic with your RMD.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN



## **Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time**

In one of his conversations with the scribes, Jesus is asked which commandment is first, and he gives a three-part answer drawing from Dt 6:4-5 and Lv 19:18. From Deuteronomy, Jesus quotes the *Shema Yisrael* (Hear, O Israel), the Jewish prayer that expresses communal faith in God and the oneness of God. He then expresses the need to love God with one's whole self. From Leviticus, Jesus stresses the importance of loving one's neighbor. Let love of God and neighbor be the foundation of our faith.

Monday, we celebrate All Saints Day. Tuesday is All Souls Day, the day we remember all who have died, and pray for them. In addition to offering Mass and praying for the souls of the faithful departed, the Church also gives us the opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence for the souls in purgatory. A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who from November 1 through 8 piously visit a cemetery and pray for the dead; or who on November 2 as well as the Sunday preceding or following, and on All Saints' Day, piously visit a church. In visiting the church, it is required that an Our Father and the Creed be recited. To acquire a plenary indulgence, it is necessary also to fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and praying the Our Father and Hail Mary for the intention of the Holy Father. The three conditions must be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the visit; it is, however, fitting that communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father be said on the same day as the visit.

Throughout the centuries, the Roman Catholic Church has held many gatherings called "synods." The word synod derives from an ancient Greek term that means "coming together" or "traveling together." Pope Francis formally opened a two-year process called "A Synod on Synodality," officially known as "Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church." In preparation for it the Synod of Bishops, each diocese has been asked by Pope Francis to foster a broad consultation process. In response to this call we are invited to have a special meeting of the parish pastoral council. Our council members will be receiving materials for discussion, which will be used for the next meeting.

The current issue of the Catholic Life Magazine carries the story of Steve and sally Miller from St Joseph Ridge. Thanks to Sally and Steve Miller for sharing their faith journey. It was great to appreciate the work of our ancestors through the words of Steve's dad "you always take care of your church and its buildings because you think of your ancestors before you and how hard they worked to make sure you had this opportunity to worship here." Beautifully said.

I appreciate and thank our catechists and coordinators for making last Wednesday a fun evening for our Religious Education Students. It was heartwarming to watch how the little ones enjoyed carving pumpkins.
