



Journey with Saint Francis de Sales

Patron of Missionaries of St Francis De Sales (1567-1622) - Part IV

Practicing little virtues as a way of growing in spiritual life:


The little virtues like patience, gentleness and humility are very often neglected by people as just the ordinary. They are definitely not "little" - on the contrary, they are great virtues, they make a difference in our day-to-day life. St. Francis de Sales saw great power in them. They can shape our lives and relationships. They also help us form and build communities.

A kind word spoken, a warm greeting, a little help, a cheerful approach, a patient listening, or a gentle look can work miracle in our daily life. The truth is that we get a lot of opportunities to practice these virtues, while the chances for practicing other socalled great virtues are very rare. One who waits for them, neglecting these little virtues, will meet with disappointment.

For Francis de Sales little virtues are those that can be practiced by anyone at any situation. For him the great virtues appear to be mere wishful thinking without the practice of the little virtues. Among all the little virtues he speaks of like: patience, good-naturedness, mortifications of the heart, humility, obedience, chastity, poverty, tenderness towards our neighbor, bearing their imperfections, diligence and holy fervor. Francis de Sales preference is for three little virtues: gentleness of heart, poverty of spirit (humility) and simplicity of life.






Picture Puzzle: An Amazing Catch!





Four Chaplains Sunday 2022



On Feb. 3, 1943, the United States Army Transport Dorchester – a converted luxury liner – was crossing the North Atlantic, transporting more than 900 troops to an American base in Greenland. Aboard the ship were four chaplains of different faiths: Reverend George Fox (Methodist), Jewish Rabbi Alexander Goode, Reverend Clark Poling (Dutch Reformed) and Father John Washington (Roman Catholic).

Around 12:55 a.m., a German U-boat fired a torpedo that struck Dorchester's starboard side, below the water line and near the engine room. The explosion instantly killed 100 men and knocked out power and radio communication with Dorchester's three escort ships. Within 20 minutes, the transport sank and more than 670 men died.

As soldiers rushed to lifeboats, the four chaplains spread out, comforting the wounded and directing others to safety. Survivors later stated that they could hear men crying, pleading, praying. They could also hear the chaplains' preaching courage. The Chaplains distributed life jackets, and when they ran out, they removed theirs and gave them to four young men. "Their voices were the only thing that kept me going. It was the finest thing I have seen, or hope to see, this side of heaven," a survivor recalled.

As Dorchester sank, the chaplains were seen linked arm in arm, singing hymns and praying to the one Lord they all served.

Fox, Goode, Poling and Washington were posthumously awarded the Distinguished Service Cross and the Purple Heart, and in 1948, Congress declared Feb. 3 to be Four Chaplains Day.

Because of the Medal of Honor's strict requirements of heroism under fire, Congress authorized a one-time Chaplain's Medal for Heroism on July 14, 1960. The award was presented to the chaplains' next of kin Jan. 18, 1961. The American Legion continues to lobby Congress to award the Chaplains the Medal of Honor.
