

## FROM THE PASTOR



First Sunday of Advent Season

#### Happy New Year!

This First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year and the countdown to Christmas. We start the Year A of the Liturgical calendar with Gospel of St. Matthew for our reflections. Advent extends over the next four Sundays and culminates on Christmas Eve. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word Adventus, which means "coming." Like Lent this is a preparatory season, one that has us looking forward and waiting for something greater. Here are a few lines from our tradition on what Advent is about. "Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare us for Christmas when Christ's first coming is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and the heart to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation." (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, #39). Advent has two parts, and we need both of them. The first is a preparation not for Christmas, but for the Second Coming. The second part of Advent is from December 17 to the 24 which prepares us to celebrate the First Coming, Christmas.

This weekend all the readings of the liturgy point to the last things, inviting us to live sober and alert, full of expectation and hope at the coming of the Lord. We are invited to be vigilant, to keep watch. 'Stay awake', 'keep watch', the Scriptures will tell us, urging us to live in expectancy and hope. How can we do that? Other than the external preparations it's also a time to prepare our soul. The sacrament of penance is an important part of our Advent preparation for a worthy celebration of Christmas. There will be additional opportunities in the deanery for confession as Christmas approaches. Look for the more details in the bulletin.

*I* wish you all a blessed preparatory time during this advent to receive the Lord. May he dispel darkness and bring you life. Let the celebration of advent be not just mere four weeks in my calendar but it is my life's calendar. Have a blessed advent!

Parishioners are invited to participate in the Advents Series that will help to prepare for Christmas. The following are the titles and presenters of these recordings. The recordings are 40 - 45 minutes, with discussion questions provided. People may be part of an organized group at the parish or watch virtually from home. • <u>1st week of Advent</u>: Jesus' True Presence in the Eucharist with Msgr. Joseph Hirsch At Christmas we read from Scripture that Jesus is Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." Jesus came on the first Christmas to save us. Again and again, Jesus comes to us in the Eucharist. Our faith comes alive as we understand better that Jesus gives us His Real Presence in the Eucharist.

• <u>2nd week of Advent</u>: Receiving and Adoring Jesus - Communion and Thanksgiving with Fr. Justin Kizewski. Jesus gives us the Gift of Himself on Christmas. Jesus continues to give us the greatest Gift – the Gift of Himself in the Eucharist again and again in a life-giving encounter. This is really the whole meaning of Christmas. Jesus came to give us Himself as food; He is literally the Bread of Life – supernatural bread that saves us, that spiritually nourishes and strengthens us with His grace.

• <u>3rd week of Advent</u>: Offering ourselves with Jesus to the Father with Msgr. Richard Gilles

• <u>4th week of Advent</u>: "Source and Summit" of the Church's Life with Father Steven Weller

#### ~How can I Prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation

- Love and forgive
- Readily accept the gift of forgiveness
- Pray (talk with God)
- Examine your conscience

to God? How well am I conveying the forgiveness of God in daily life?

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Andrew Feast Day: November 30

Saint Andrew was a fisherman in Galilee, along with his brother, Peter, when they were called by Jesus to leave their boat and become fishers of men. John's Gospel also places him as a follower of John the Baptist before he came to

be one of Jesus' twelve Disciples. Beyond the scant references in the Gospels, not much is known of Saint Andrew's life.

According to Christian tradition Saint Andrew, like many of his fellow Disciples went out into Greece and Turkey to preach the Good News. A 4th century account of the saint's life tells of his martyrdom by crucifixion in Patras. Medieval accounts describe the cross used as X-shaped because Andrew said he was not worthy to die on the same style of cross as Jesus.

Famously Saint Andrew is the patron Saint of Scotland, the country's flag bearing the X-shaped cross associated with him. Legends claim that the saint either traveled to Scotland to spread the Gospel or that his relics were brought there by St. Regulus who had a vision telling him to take the bones to the end of the earth. Regulus set out and was shipwrecked on the coast of Scotland. Today relics of St. Andrew which had been held by the Vatican are now at a shrine in Patras.
