

**** "Blessed are the poor in spirit . . . they who mourn . . . the meek . . . they who hunger and thirst for righteousness . . . the merciful . . . the clean of heart . . . the peacemakers . . . "

The Lord Jesus gave the greatest summation of the Christian way of life in his Sermon on the Mount (cf. Mt 5-7). "The Beatitudes," form the first part of it. The early Christians saw the Beatitudes as the path to happiness. Everyone has a different idea of what the word 'blessed' means. Many would attribute money, power, and position, as sign of being blessed. So many people never find happiness because they do not know where to look for it.

Too many people say "If only I had that," they often say, "I would be happy" Blessedness is something inherent. It's a gift from God. It springs from our relationship with God. Can I hear Jesus tell me about "Blessed are the poor in spirit . . . they who mourn . . . the meek . . . they who hunger and thirst for righteousness . . . the merciful . . . the clean of heart . . . the peacemakers . . ." Where do I belong?

The National Catholic Schools week begins this week, with the theme: "Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service". Catholic schools were begun with the specific purpose to form students to become good Catholics by instilling in them the values that would make them good citizens of the world, so that they would enrich the society with the leaven of the gospel and the example of faith. May God bless the ministry of Catholic education and all those who are involved in it.

St. Blaise Blessing: Blessing of the Throats will take place at the conclusion of Mass on Friday, February 3rd at St. Peters and on Saturday after 4:00 pm mass at St. Joseph. St Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia. He is associated with the healing of throats. He was martyred during the persecution of Licinius, early 4th century.

~Feast of Blessed Brother James Miller – February 13




Saint of the Week

St. John Bosco (1815-1888) January 31

John Bosco was an Italian Catholic priest, educator and writer of the 19th century, who put into practice the convictions of his religion, dedicating his life to the betterment and education

of street children, juvenile delinguents, and other disadvantaged youth and employing teaching methods based on love rather than punishment. A follower of the spirituality and philosophy of Francis de Sales, Bosco dedicated his works to him when he founded the Society of St. Francis de Sales (more commonly known as the Salesian Society or the Salesians of Don Bosco). Together with Maria Domenica Mazzarello, he founded the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, popularly known as Salesian Sisters. In 1876 Bosco founded a movement of laity, the Salesian Cooperators, with the same educational mission to the poor. He is patron saint of editors. He is known as the "Apostle of Youth".
