Four Chaplains Sunday

On Feb. 3, 1943, the United States Army Transport Dorchester – a converted luxury liner – was crossing the North Atlantic, transporting more than 900 troops to an American base in Greenland. Aboard the ship were four chaplains of different faiths: Reverend George Fox (Methodist), Jewish Rabbi Alexander Goode, Reverend Clark Poling (Dutch Reformed) and Father John Washington (Roman Catholic).

Around 12:55 a.m., a German U-boat fired a torpedo that struck Dorchester's starboard side, below the water line and near the engine room. The explosion instantly killed 100 men and knocked out power and radio communication with Dorchester's three escort ships. Within 20 minutes, the transport sank and more than 670 men died.

As soldiers rushed to lifeboats, the four chaplains spread out, comforting the wounded and directing others to safety. Survivors later stated that they could hear men crying, pleading, praying. They also could also hear the chaplains' preaching courage. Their voices were the only thing that kept me going. The Chaplains distributed life jackets, and when they ran out, they removed theirs and gave them to four young men. "It was the finest thing I have seen, or hope to see, this side of heaven," a survivor recalled.

As Dorchester sank, the chaplains were seen linked arm in arm, singing hymns and praying to the one Lord they all served.

Of the 902 men aboard the U.S.A.T. Dorchester, only 230 survived. Before boarding the Dorchester back in January, Chaplain Poling had asked his father to pray for him, "Not for my safe return, that wouldn't be fair. Just pray that I shall do my duty...never be a coward...and have the strength, courage and understanding of men. Just pray that I shall be adequate".

Although the Distinguished Service Cross and Purple Heart were later awarded posthumously Congress wished to confer the Medal of Honor but was blocked by the stringent requirements which required heroism performed under fire. So a posthumous Special Medal for Heroism, The Four Chaplains' Medal, was authorized by Congress and awarded by the President on January 18, 1961. It was never given before and will never be given again.

FROM THE PASTOR





"You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world".

Light dispels darkness, light makes things visible, light gives warmth, light heals, lights makes the way visible... This is what the disciples are called to be for the world...to be men and women whose presence dispels darkness, reveals the truth, encourages warmth of affection, facilitates healing of brokenness, shows the way...

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd. Wherever you go and whatever you do this week, remember to sprinkle your "salt" and shine your "light"! Because "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world".

This coming Saturday, February 11, is the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes and the 31st annual World Day of the Sick. On that day specially remember and pray for all who are sick in your own family, friends circle and community. Sick people, in fact, are at the center of God's people, and the Church advances together with them as a sign of a humanity in which everyone is precious and no one should be discarded or left behind.


