"Welcome to the 2nd Sunday of Lent!

Last Sunday we followed Jesus into the desert. In today's Gospel, Jesus is with his disciples on the mount of transfiguration. His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. Jesus' Transfiguration occurs in the context of His journey to Jerusalem, the place of his suffering and death. In the context of uncertainty and fear. This brief glimpse of Jesus in all his glory is also meant for us today. Perhaps like the disciples, we too experience fear, doubt and even a lack of faith. Perhaps we too need to be encouraged and strengthened by Jesus, especially as we continue our journey through Lent. The transfiguration of Jesus is a small glimpse of the destination of the Lenten journey, Christ's risen glory.
