

FROM THE PASTOR



Palm Sunday "Hosanna to the Son of David"

With Passion (Palm) Sunday we begin our Holy Week. It takes us to the liturgies of the Triduum-Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, and the Easter Vigil.

On Palm Sunday we recall Jesus' entry into the holy city, Jerusalem with the greetings 'Hosanna to the Son of David," the salutation to a deliverer, the Messiah. People celebrate the joy of the Messiah. It was short lived. The joy of the entry into Jerusalem is replaced by fear as we move on. The disciples who celebrated a final meal with Jesus, all desert him. The fear among the disciples losses its grip only after the post resurrection apparitions of Jesus.

Before his passion he had his last meal with his chosen ones. The liturgy of Holy Thursday celebrates the Last Supper of the Lord and the various events of the night before Jesus suffered his passion. The institution of the Holy Eucharist, the institution of the priesthood and the new commandment to love is celebrated on this day. On Holy Thursday at end of the service we are led to silence, adoration, thankfulness to the lord in the blessed sacrament.

The liturgy of the Good Friday is solemn. If Holy Thursday points to the sacramental outpouring of the Lord, then Good Friday points to the graphic emptying of Christ. He faces the cruelty of death, betrayal, pain, abandonment and humiliation. The passion narrative tells us all. "Christ Jesus, though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross". Philippines 2:6-11. The Good Friday liturgy shows us how much Christ loved us. Christ gives us His life, body and spirit. In the light of the death of Christ we stand in owe and profound silence. Christ redeems us though His humanity which remains faithful to God. Jesus' faithfulness undoes or redeems our unfaithfulness.

Holy Saturday is a day of great silence in the church. Mass is not celebrated. Sacraments are not celebrated. We are called to face the meaning of the death of Christ in our lives. The liturgy of the Easter vigil begins at night with kindling of the new fire and the Easter proclamation." rejoice heavenly powers...." The Easter liturgy and Easter season announces the resurrection of Christ. We profess our faith that He is our Lord.

3:30 PM Blessing with the relic of St. Faustina.



"On that day (Divine Mercy Sunday), the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." - Diary of St. Faustina #699

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in the early 1930s. He told her that he would make her a missionary of His Divine Mercy to the world. As part of that mission, He gave her the prayers for the Divine Mercy Novena (a nine -day prayer that begins on Good Friday of each year and ends on the Sunday after Easter Sunday (Divine Mercy Sunday). What makes this novena unique is that Jesus Himself composed it and each day a prayer can be offered for one specific group of souls such as children, priests and religious, lukewarm souls, fallen-away Catholics, and so on. Pray the Divine Mercy Novena (starting on Good Friday) in preparation for this feast. For more information on Divine Mercy, go to the divinemercy.org.
