

FROM THE PASTOR

Easter Sunday

After nearly six weeks, our Lenten pilgrimage has ended with the celebration of the saving passion and death of Jesus.



We can now cry out with the whole Church throughout the world and with Christians everywhere,

"Alleluia! Christ is Risen!"

Jesus, the Light of the World, has risen from the dead and conquered death and sin and darkness forever.

In the early morning darkness of that first Easter Mary Magdalene and the other disciples saw the stone removed from the tomb and burial shrouds in an empty tomb. It is written "he (apostle John) went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place "He saw and believed." Today we are asked to believe and proclaim the unbelievable: that he who was dead has arisen and is alive.

Easter is the greatest and most important feast in the church for three reasons.

1) The resurrection is the basis of our Christian faith.

2) Easter is the guarantee of our own Resurrection. Jesus said to Martha at the tomb of Lazarus, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me will live even though he dies.

3) And lastly, Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrow and tears.

During the Easter season I request you to keep our CCD students and teachers in your thoughts and prayers as some of our CCD students will receive their First Holy Communion in the coming days and on Wednesday Confirmation will be conferred upon young people from both parishes. Thanks to the CCD teachers and coordinators for helping them to prepare for the reception of these sacraments.

Next Sunday which is also Divine Mercy Sunday, a second collection is traditionally taken up throughout our diocese for the support of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women. Please take this opportunity to support them and the many ways in which they contribute to the work of the Church in our diocese.

Thanks to the choir, people who were decorating the church and people who helped with various ministries. May God bless you for your generosity.



May the blessings of Easter fill your hearts, minds and homes with joy, peace and hope!



Divine Mercy Sunday—April 16th

The Church celebrates the Feast of Divine Mercy the Sunday after Easter, April 16th. This is a fitting time to focus on God's forgiving love, the mercy poured out through the suffering, death and resurrection of His Son, including the mercy He shows each one of us in ways too numerous to count.



Mercy means God's Heart desiring to alleviate our

misery. Personal sin causes misery. The "Good News" is that Jesus is the Divine Physician who came to heal the sickness of sin. As we receive the forgiveness He offers in the Sacrament of Confession, we are compelled by this love to trust in Him and avoid sin in the future. The word "trust" is significant as it is a key aspect of the Divine Mercy message from Jesus. Trust is not blind, wishful thinking but hope based upon the Person who gave His life for us. Jesus describes Himself as the Good Shepherd who leaves the ninety-nine to go after the one lost sheep. He is grieved – heartsick – until He finds this one sheep, and then lifts it upon His shoulders and carries it home. This describes Jesus' deep and personal love for *each* one of us.

Trust starts small and grows through experience. We practice and live trust on a daily basis "by praising and thanking God in all things." (Consoling the Heart of Jesus, Fr. Michael Gaitley, p. 95) This is the most practical place to start in our desire to trust Jesus in everyday circumstances. Watch for the effect it will have!
