

FROM THE PASTOR

The Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

The theme of humility is central to our readings today. God Himself is a humble God, so if we wish to follow Him as Christian stewards, we must be humble. Humility is crucial to the stewardship way of life and to a peaceful and fulfilling life.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus Himself speaks to the Father about the privileged role that humble souls play in God's plan of salvation. "I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones."

What does it mean to be a "little one"? It means that we acknowledge we don't have it all figured out but are very much in need of a savior. It means we recognize that all we are and have is a gift from God. It means we embrace the stewardship way of life.

It is not easy, but deep peace and consolation come with this way of life. Jesus offers these warm and encouraging words to entice us to embrace them. "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Let us resolve to follow in the footsteps of our Savior, embracing the humble path of stewardship. The way leads to peace here and now and ultimately leads us to heaven.

This past week, Father Biju and his companions went to Detroit. They visited Solanus Casey Center where Blessed Solanus Casey is buried.

Father Solanus Casey was born in November 25, 1870 on a farm in Prescott, Wisconsin. He entered St. Francis Seminary in Milwaukee. He was invested in the Capuchin Order at Detroit in 1897 and then was ordained in 1904. Fr. Solanus was always ready and willing to listen to anyone any time of the day or

night. Fr. Solanus is known as the Servant of the sick and poor.

During his final illness, he remarked: "I'm offering my suffering that all might be one. If only I could see the conversion of the whole world." His last conscious act was to sit up in bed and exclaim: "I give my soul to Jesus Christ." He was Declared Blessed by Pope Francis in 2017 and is presently being considered for Canonization.

~<u>Eucharistic Revival</u> A Minute with Jesus: The Eucharist is called the Breaking of Bread. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave thanks, then blessed and broke the bread and gave it to the Apostles. Jesus repeated this action on the day of His Resurrection as He shared a meal with the disciples in Emmaus. The disciples had left Jerusalem, believing that Jesus was dead. As Jesus walked with the disciples to Emmaus, they did not recognize Him. It was in the "breaking of the bread" that He opened their eyes to recognize Him as the risen Lord. This transfigured Bread

and Wine – the Eucharist – is the Gift of Himself to them, and now to us. Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

Jesus, please grant me the grace to recognize You in the Holy Eucharist – please reveal this reality to my heart!



This week, read the passage of the disciples recognizing Jesus in "the breaking of the bread" in Luke 24:13-35.




Prayer to Prepare for Mass
