

## Twenty-EighthSunday in Ordinary Time

Through the parable of the Royal Wedding Banquet, we hear the thrilling invitation of Jesus: Come to my feast! Put on your glorious

attire! Enter into my joy! This is God's invitation to us to enter eternal life. And yet: this parable does not make us feel at all comfortable. For the weight of this story falls not so much on the invitation, as on the refusal of those invited.

In the journey of Christian Discipleship, responsiveness to God's call is paramount. Spiritual growth is anchored in our ability to recognize and honor these divine invitations, stepping into the fullness of life they promise. The essence of Christian discipleship lies in our daily choices. Each decision to embrace God's call propels us closer to spiritual growth and eternal fellowship with Him. Obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us. Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. There is freedom there is mercy in him. Remember how Peter who denied him gets reunited with Christ. Ultimately our choice for him matters.

Eucharistic miracles Exhibit will be at St Peter October 18-22. I hope everyone take advantage of the exhibit and grow in our faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. There will be a presentation on the 18th to talk to the CCD students, parents and parishioners on the related topic.



~<u>Eucharistic Revival</u>— A Minute with Jesus is meant to inspire parishioners during the Eucharistic Revival, a movement to help all Catholics know and believe that the Eucharist is Jesus. <u>God created me out of love.</u>

God will never stop loving me. Our Heavenly Father speaks these words to me in the Bible: "My steadfast (unwavering, always ongoing) love shall not depart from you" (Isaiah 54:10). God proved His love for me in this way: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that whoever believes in Him may not die but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). God's boundless love includes Jesus establishing one Church

and instituting seven Sacraments so that we may be united with Him. The closest union we can have with Jesus on earth is receiving the Eucharist – His own Body and Blood.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Heavenly Father, help me to know how much You truly love me.

This week, read how nothing can separate us from the love of Jesus Christ, except our own choice to reject His love in Romans 8:35, 37-38.

### ~Exploring the presence of Christ both inside and outside the Mass

Prior to His ascension to the right hand of the Father, Jesus makes us a beautiful promise: "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). Since that time, the Church finds Jesus in the midst of His believers, in the proclamation of His word, and in the action of the Sacraments. But She encounters Him most fully in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Jesus' Eucharistic presence is called "real"—a term that doesn't imply that His other existences with us are somehow "unreal," but "to indicate presence par excellence, because it is substantial and through it Christ becomes present whole and entire, God and man" (Pope Paul VI, Mysterium Fidei, 39). In other words, by the power of God, the priest's words over the bread and wine at Mass change the substance of these elements into the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus. Unlike the other presences of Christ in the Mass, however, the Eucharistic presence of Jesus remains long after the Mass has ended.

People are present to one another in many ways: in thought, in memory, in bodily proximity, in sympathy. So too with Jesus: His presence in our midst is as real as any other. What a comfort that He remains with us as He promised! For centuries, His saints and faithful have had Christ as a real companion on their journey to the Promised Land.
