

Thirty First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Spiritual Reflection for November 5th

There is no question that Jesus had a way with words. The Word of the Lord is filled with what we are familiar with in our society — soundbites, which convey so much meaning. The last verses of today's Gospel from St. Matthew contain one short statement with much more meaning. Jesus says, "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

Those two sentences are the key to a stewardship way of life, which revolves around service and humility. There is no question that these are powerful words. They reveal to us all that we need to understand to be a true disciple of Christ. In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul wrote, "Though He was in the form of God, He did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." (Phil. 2:5-8).

God will ultimately exalt true humility. Our society teaches us to strive to reach the top, but Jesus reminds us to regard others as more important than we are.

Perhaps we have two choices in life: to be selfexalters or God-exalted. Is there any doubt about what we should pursue as Christians?


