

## FROM THE PASTOR



## Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I am back from India. Had wonderful time with my family and I had a chance to visit the mission and meet some of our fathers working in north east of India. Time to reconnect and visit. Thank you for your prayers.

As I landed I heard the disappointing news about the upcoming closure of Catholic hospitals, HSHS Sacred Heart in Eau Claire and St. Joseph's in Chippewa Falls after nearly 140 years of service to the community. Four years back I began my ministry there. It's impossible to recount the many lives touched and healed through these hospitals—both spiritual and physical. Extension of Jesus healing ministry.

In the gospel we encounter Jesus heals a leper. We read - A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Mark 1: 40-45. The man with leprosy took the initiative, approaching Jesus and asking for healing. In doing so, the leper violated the religious customs of the day by approaching a person who was clean. The confidence of the leper in Jesus' ability to heal him is evident in the words of his request. Jesus touched him and healed him, a sign of Jesus' compassion for the man. How do we deal with people who are ostracized by the society. Are we willing to reach out to them and bring comfort to them?



February 11 is World Day of the Sick, an observation started by St. John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The Pope initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to

pray not only for those who suffer from illness but also for their caregivers. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

<u>Sunday, Feb. 11 is World Marriage Day</u>. This annual observance is to honor husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. The very celebration of world marriage day is an opportunity to focus on building a culture of life and love that begins with supporting and promoting marriage and the family. As I congratulate all the married men and women on this special day, I thank them sincerely for their faithfulness and sacrifice in living out their married life. **Congratulations to David and Paula Hilby as they celebrate their 60**<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary.

**LENT is upon us!** This year Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day are both on February 14! As we receive ashes on our forehead, let it be a visible symbol of our



acknowledgement of our mortality and our dependence on a God who offers us His merciful love always. Let it be a time of renewal. I invite you to focus on at least one area of your life which needs some attention. I also invite all families to spend some time in prayer, if possible, in the church, or participate in Eucharistic Adoration, Stations of the cross, and certainly participate in the Mass. Happy Lent!

#### **Lenten Regulations:**

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14. Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

**A Minute with Jesus during the National Eucharistic Revival Jesus wants us to know He is continually with us.**Oftentimes, our mind begins to wander at Mass because we only see bread and wine. What contributes to our distractions is the bombardment of noise and images in our minds that come through our physical senses (hearing, seeing). Therefore, we are much less attuned to the world of the spirit and the much deeper spiritual realities that are right here, all around us. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: *Jesus, help me to learn to be quiet and reveal to my heart the truth that the Eucharist is really You present under the appearance of bread and wine.* This week, read about Jacob in the desert, who was very much afraid, and came to realize that God was present right there with him. As with Jacob, we can say as we pray before the Blessed Sacrament, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it." (Genesis 28:10-17)
