FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY or VOCATION SUNDAY

In each of our three lectionary cycles, the Sunday Gospel is taken from the 10th chapter of the Gospel of John. This chapter of John's Gospel follows Jesus' healing of the man born blind and the rejection of this miracle by the Jewish leaders

who question Jesus' authority to heal. Jesus responds to this challenge by calling himself the Good Shepherd.

Jesus describes his relationship with his followers as similar to the relationship between a good shepherd and his sheep. As a good shepherd will risk and lay down his life in order to protect his sheep. Jesus willingly sacrifices himself for the sake of his sheep. Jesus contrasts the actions of the good shepherd with the actions of the hired shepherd who abandons the sheep in the face of danger. In the verses following Jesus' teaching, we learn that the Pharisees and the other religious leaders understand that Jesus is referring to them when he describes the hired shepherds.

The concern of a good shepherd for his sheep is part of the shepherd's job. The good shepherd knows the sheep and therefore acts out of love. This is at the heart of the difference between the good shepherd and the hired shepherd. For the Good Shepherd, shepherding is never simply part of a job; but it's an integral part of his identity. On this day we are especially asked first of all to pray that the Church may be provided with the leaders needed to do its work of spreading the Gospel. Pray for also for priests, deacons and religious and laity. Following is a prayer from our diocese for vocations.

Prayer for Vocations:

Heavenly Father, Bless your Church with an abundance of holy and zealous priests, deacons, brothers, and sisters. Give those you have called to the married state and those you have chosen to live as single persons in the world, the special graces that their lives require. Form us all in the likeness of Your Son, so that in Him, with Him, and through Him, we may love you more deeply and serve you more faithfully, always and everywhere. With Mary, we ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
