Jesus in the district of Decapolis which was largely a gentile territory. Jesus' ministry was open to all, not just to the Jews. We read about a deaf man brought to Jesus for healing. Jesus took him aside, away from the crowd, touched him and healed him, using the words "Ephphatha!".



#### ~Organ Recital - Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman- Sept 22




