



'Waiting for Christ''

We have entered the urgent and powerful season of Advent, a time to prepare with awe and wonder for the Feast of the Incarnation of Jesus — born to us as Savior and Brother. It is a season to prepare for His return at the end of time. It is also a moment to remind ourselves that our judgment day is coming, too, when we will have to give an account for all that God has given us during our lifetimes.

Our readings for the first week of Advent are not just about the urgency of preparation of one's life; they also offer us practical advice, calling our attention to these themes of reflection and preparation. They seem to shout, "Wake up! Get ready!" and guide us as we enter this season.

The Gospel, from Luke, warns, "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life."

How easy it is to lose focus on our Lord either by too much indulgence in our lives or too much worry about our lives. During Advent, we must ask ourselves some hard questions. Am I staying faithful to my prayer life? Am I using my energy and skills to serve others? Am I overly concerned about material gain? Am I relying on my material blessings as my source of comfort or security?

Am I living for the moment or the coming of the Lord? Get ready, He's coming! Let us prepare with awe and wonder, and let this preparation inspire us to action.

A Minute with Jesus: Jesus came into the world to save us by reconciling us with God

Through the original sin, Adam and Eve separated themselves from God. They lost the gift of grace – God's very life within them. They were no longer united with God in a relationship of love. Further, there was nothing Adam and Eve, or you and I, could do to fix the problems instigated by the original sin, above all, our separation from God. The "Good News" is that Jesus came to be among us as our Savior, to reconcile us with God. To accomplish this, Christ established one Church and instituted seven sacraments. Still today the sacraments are the means through which we receive God's gift of grace, His divine life within us. This shows how much God loves us: He wants to be so close that He wants to dwell within us! The holy Eucharist is the greatest of the sacraments by bringing us into the closest union with Jesus on Earth. Let us prepare our hearts before Mass every Sunday for so great a Gift! Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

Jesus, thank You for coming for us on the first Christmas, as well as Your coming to us most especially in the holy Eucharist on Christmas. This week, read how the prophet Isaiah announced the coming of the Messiah in Isaiah 11:1-3.

a 4th-century bishop of Myra, is the inspiration for Santa Claus. Known for his generosity, he secretly left gold coins in the shoes of those in need, a tradition that still exists in many cultures today.

Nicholas of Myra died on December 346, giving rise to the

present Feast of Saint Nicholas. The saint was entombed in St. Nicholas Church, Demre, though in 1087, Italian soldiers transferred his remains to Italy, where they were enshrined in the Basilica di San Nicola and are held to this day.


