Second Sunday of Advent

Quite likely you have a long checklist of things that you need to do before Christmas, which is now only three weeks away. But is “repentance for the forgiveness of sins” on that list? Advent is the time given to us to revive our hopes for the glorious coming of our Savior. St John teaches us to *prepare the way for the Lord*. But it is not about the path in a literal sense, but rather about our hearts, about our conversion, that is, cleansing ourselves from sins, about getting rid of pride and selfishness, about smoothing out roughness in dealing with our neighbors, about acting for what is good. And so, we have to make our own lives a straight path to God, a path without potholes we can fall into nor compromises that can send us on a detour. This is our task. Let us not waste the time that is given to us - let us convert ourselves and pray for the conversion of others.



This is a major feast—in fact a Holy Day of Obligation—for the Church in the United States of America. This year is an exception with the feast not being a holy day of obligation. But we do have masses in both churches. Mary as the Immaculate Conception is the Patron Saint of the United States and Brazil.

There will be a price increase on the Cemetery plots and Columbarium niches—starting January 1, 2025.

Below are the details:




Cemetery Plot fees:

- Parishioner: \$500.00
- Former Parishioner: \$700.00
- Non-members: \$1,000.00

Columbarium Niche fees:

- Parishioner: \$700.00
- Former Parishioner: \$850.00
- Non-Members: \$900.00



At time of burial, there is a charge for opening of grave or niche. Below are the fees:

- Plot opening (full burial): \$550.00
- Plot opening (cremation): \$400.00
- Niche opening: \$75.00

Burial specifications:

- ~ Only one casket and one cremain, OR two cremains per plot.
- ~ Two cremains per niche (Columbarium)

A Minute with Jesus: Jesus came into the world so that we might know God’s love.

It is deeply moving to read these words from Scripture: “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life” (John 3:16). During this holy season of Advent, we want to take time to ponder the meaning of Christmas, as proof of God’s love for us. The Nativity of Our Lord celebrates the point in history when the Son of God took on human flesh for our Salvation – an act of loving obedience to the Father, and saving love for us, in order to offer Himself for us on the Cross, and now, give Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist.



Let’s pray this right now and every day this week:

Heavenly Father, help me to realize how much You love me in that You sent Your Son on the first Christmas as my Savior.

This week, read how the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that She would be the Mother of our Savior in Luke 1:26-38.

When we imitate Mary’s faith and trust, the power of God can work through us.

~Winter Labyrinth Walk (in-person) Wed, Dec 18

Drop in any time between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

In the days leading up to the Winter Solstice, you are invited to walk the FSC's indoor canvas labyrinth. This is a silent, self-guided meditation. A labyrinth is a single path that has been used as a walking meditation for prayer and reflection since ancient times. For many, it is symbolic of a pilgrimage and can help bring about clarity, peace and healing. Plan on at least a half-hour, but you are welcome to spend as much time walking and reflecting on the experience as you like. For those new to the labyrinth, we'll provide a brief introduction.

Note: If you would like to bring younger children to experience the labyrinth, we ask that you visit between 3:30 and 4 p.m. Freewill offering Registration is appreciated but not required.
