


Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org.

The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting.

Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

On this Feast of the Ascension, a day filled with deep joy and celebration, we commemorate Christ's victorious return to the Father after fulfilling His mission on

earth. This Feast, which holds great significance in our spiritual journey, marks a joyful commemoration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples. This moment fills us with hope and inspiration.

Today's Gospel focuses on the explicit guidance Jesus provided to His disciples—and, by extension, to us—just before His ascension to the Father: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You, each of you, are witnesses of these things, entrusted with the crucial task of spreading His message.

Adopting a stewardship lifestyle—focused on how we use our time, talent, and treasure—enables us to live in a way that reflects the Good News of the Gospel. As a parish family, we take time each year to renew our commitments in these three domains. However, it is essential for each of us to allocate time throughout the year to continually evaluate our commitments, considering both our strengths and areas where we can grow further.



~A Minute with Jesus: Receiving the Eucharist – Our Closest Union with Jesus on Earth The Mass is a representation of the Holy Sacrifice that Jesus made of Himself on the cross for our salvation. Because God is outside time and space, at Mass the same sacrifice that Jesus offered for our sins is made present. When we receive holy Communion at Mass, we are receiving Jesus Himself, which is our closest union with Him on earth. Taking His Body and Blood into our own bodies, we are united with Him in a deep and intimate bond. Jesus feeds our souls, strengthening us to be faithful by loving and serving Him through serving others, most especially those in need. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus please strengthen me to be committed to coming to Mass early so that I can spend some time quietly preparing to be united with You in holy Communion. This week read the words of Jesus about remaining in Him and He in us in John 6:54-58.

Jesus Ascends into Heaven!



Today we celebrate the feast of the Ascension- when Jesus went up, body and soul, into Heaven. Forty days after Jesus rose from the dead He took his disciples up to a big hill and told them that He was going to send the Holy Spirit to them soon. Then He went up into the sky and disappeared behind the clouds.

At first it seems kind of sad that Jesus left His friends, doesn't it? But how could they be sad when Jesus was returning with joy to His Father in Heaven?


~La Crosse Warming Center Summer Services
