

SIXTEENTH **SUNDAY IN** ORDINARY TIME

The Gospel reading from St. Luke, we are reminded about the proper use of the gift of time, an essential part of living as good stewards. Our passage highlights one of the most famous dinner parties ever hosted, recalling the day when Martha and Mary welcomed our Lord into their home. We are told that Martha, as a faithful steward, welcomes Christ in but then becomes "burdened with much serving," while her sister and fellow hostess chooses to sit with Jesus. listening to Him speak.

Martha becomes indignant at Mary's behavior and complains to Jesus, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." But Jesus, in His infinite wisdom, refuses to get pulled into this sisterly spat. Instead, He offers Martha a new perspective on the situation. "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing."

What is that one thing?

It is to put Jesus first in our lives and above all else;

to "sit at his feet" and listen as Mary did, giving Him the priority of our time, no matter how busy we think we are. When we genuinely commit to putting Christ first in our daily routines through regular prayer and frequent participation in the sacraments, we can be confident that all our other concerns, no matter how urgent or overwhelming they seem, are under His loving care.

Why is this so? Because the time we invest in our relationship with God saturates all aspects of our lives with His grace, transforming even the most mundane tasks into opportunities for spiritual growth. And because God cannot be outdone in generosity, He will abundantly reward any sacrifice we make to spend time with Him.


