

God Gives us What

In today's Gospel reading, the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray, so He taught them the "Our Father."

In the first part of the "Our Father" we give glory to God by

praising Him, and in the second part we ask Him for the things we need. First we ask for our daily bread. This can be asking both for the things like food that our bodies need, and for the spiritual things as well, especially Holy Communion. Next we ask for forgiveness for our sins and for God to keep us away from temptation and evil.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY

IN ORDINARY TIME

In the Gospel reading from Luke, some of Jesus's disciples ask our Lord to teach them how to pray. Jesus


immediately gives them the beautiful prayer, which we, of course, call the *Our Father*.

The Our Father is truly a prayer of stewardship. In it, we intimately call upon God as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, and everything belongs to Him. Our focus in life should be on His priorities, not our own. Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give us our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim our complete trust in His provision for us and His mercy towards us. We, too, have the responsibility to extend mercy ourselves, as we forgive those who sin against us.

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we acknowledge this fundamental truth about ourselves and God: God is our Father, and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children. This forms the foundation of a stewardship lifestyle.

At the end of the Gospel passage, Jesus encourages us to build a relationship with the Father: Ask Him, seek Him, and knock on His door!

He eagerly anticipates blessing us, His children. Keep this in mind throughout the week; then go out and be a source of blessing to others! Stewardship is as joyous and straightforward as that.

<u>Gospel:</u> Luke Luke 11:1-13

All of Scripture tells of the necessity of prayer,

and Jesus exhorts us to be persistent because something powerful happens in that repetition. As we ask, as we return to the source of mercy and love, *we* are changed by our encounter with God. God is faithful. God is merciful.

"Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." *Luке 11:9*


