

# HUMILITY IS NOT THINKING LESS OF YOURSELF, IT IS THINKING OF YOURSELF LESS. -C.S. Lewis

# TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings remind us of a chief virtue that characterizes the

Christian steward: humility. This virtue is often mistaken for self-abasement. However, that view misses the mark. Humility is simply the awareness of who (and Whose) we truly are. It's about acknowledging our dependence on God and recognizing that all we have is a gift from Him. With this understanding, we should reflect this in our daily interactions, decisions, and service to others.

On one hand, we are children of the Most High God who loved us into existence and who, by virtue of our Baptism, has the Holy Trinity dwelling within us. This divine origin of our being should fill us with awe and gratitude. On the other hand, we are children who are utterly dependent on God for our existence and every breath we take.

Jesus is reminding us that all glory belongs to God. The visual image He offers, of having to slide down to a lower seat at the table, shows how foolish we are when we forget to give God the credit for our blessings and talents.

On the other hand, when we live in humility — recognizing that all we have is a gift from God and using those gifts to serve Him and others — then God "exalts" us by filling us with even more of Himself and His grace. It's His grace that enables us to serve and share with humility, and it's through our humble service that we receive more of His grace, creating a beautiful cycle of divine love and human service.

Jesus continues to encourage us to serve and share our blessings with people facing circumstances that would make it impossible for them to offer us any worldly advantage or prestige — "the poor, the crippled, the lame."

Our attitude, along with how we serve and share, should be rooted in genuine humility — recognizing that we are all "little" ones in God's eyes. This sense of equality in God's view helps everyone feel included and appreciated. We are all His children, brothers and sisters, invited to our Father's heavenly banquet.

#### God calls us to humble service.

<u>First Reading</u>: Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29 <u>Second Reading</u>: Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a <u>Gospel</u>: Luke 14:1, 7-14

Humility helps us to see ourselves clearly and not to grasp at what is beyond our strength. Both the reading from Sirach and Luke's Gospel tell us that those who humble themselves will find favor with God. They also point to a connection between humility and service. Those who give alms — who give without expecting repayment — will receive their reward in heaven.

#### ~Celebrate Rural Life Day - Sept. 22, 2025 - Warrens, WI


