

# TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME


The four pillars of parish stewardship are *hospitality*, *prayer*, *formation*, *and service*. These pillars serve not only as a guide but also as a reassurance of our spiritual growth. Today's readings highlight the profound importance of prayer and its unique role in both our individual lives and the life of our parish community.

Our Lord Himself calls us to prayer and persistence in prayer in the Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus shares the parable of the persistent widow who finally wears down the judge with her relentless pursuit of a just ruling on her behalf. This story powerfully reminds us of the transformative power of persistent prayer. Even a judge who "neither feared God nor respected any human being" was moved to deliver a just judgment because of the widow's persistence. This should fill us with hope and empowerment, knowing that our loving, all-merciful Father will respond to our persistent prayers to Him.

Jesus uses this vivid example to compare a reluctant, dishonest judge with our loving, merciful Father. This stark contrast should help us understand the depth of God's love and mercy. If even a bad judge responds to persistent requests, how much more will our good Father eagerly and perfectly answer our persistent prayers?

Even if God's response seems delayed or different from what we expected, we can remain confident and trust in His goodness. His response, whenever it comes and in whatever form, will be the very best for us. This reassurance should bring us peace and security in our faith.

Our role as Christian stewards is to stay faithful in our relationship with God through prayer. We should rely on each other in our communities—whether family or parish—as we support one another through prayer and mutual encouragement. Remember, a strong foundation of prayer will make all our other stewardship efforts successful. Together, we can strengthen our faith and community through prayer.


#### ~October is Respect Life Month:


